


#### Total funds distributed to students

### **About the Program**

The California Community Colleges Finish Line
Scholars Program supports students to ensure they stay
on track with their education and complete a degree,
certificate, or transfer to a four year college or university.
The program is intended to help eliminate regional
educational gaps through distribution of emergency
financial aid to students facing unexpected hardships and
scholarships to students who are well on their way toward
a finish line goal of transferring to a college or university or
completing a certificate or degree.

The Jay Pritzker Foundation has pledged \$100 million over a span of 20 years to support this program. For the first five years, starting in 2020, scholarships and emergency financial aid are being distributed to students at 34 colleges in three regions of California: the Inland Empire, the Central Valley, and the Far North.

These three regions have the lowest rates of educational attainment of adults. They also have a high percentage of students without access to broadband, students living below the poverty line, high school students who receive free or reduced price lunch, and other factors that make them a priority. Increasing the number of people who have a college education in these regions will **help decrease poverty and increase local opportunities.**
